Callough and her heirs and assigns have granted sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said James McCallough all that plantation or tract of land containing Eleven hundred and fifty seven acres (more or less) known as the Home Tract situate and lying in Greenville District on both sides of the Greenville Road on the north of House and Mountain Creeks beginning on an Ash 34 and running thence S 20 E 30 to a stake 35 thence S 75 E 34 to a Black Oak 35 bounded by lands belonging to the said Estate thence S 44 E 21 00 to a stake 34 thence S 30 E 19 50 to a Red Oak 34 bounded by Elizabeth Gains thence S 28 41 33 30 to a Spanish Oak 34 thence S 49 41 47 12 75 to a poplar 34 thence N 5 E 76 75 to a white oak 34 bounded by lands belonging to said estate thence S 83 W. 89 36 to a stake 34 bounded by W. G. Johnson thence S 11 W 77 90 to a stake 34 and so on to a stake 29 E 11 to a stake 34 bounded by Micajah Jordan and Jesse Fenwick (the last name came on a small creek) thence down the meanders of said creek about 47 chains to the mouth of a small branch thence up the meanders of said branch to the beginning

To have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said James McCallough his heirs and assigns forever And we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and defende all and singular the said premises unto said James McCallough his heirs and assigns against ourselves and our heirs and against every other person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof
