or either party to these presents that until default shall be made in the payment
of eight of the sum aforesaid as before set forth and the interest of the same it
is the said party and may be lawful to and for the said Charles J. Garrison peace-
ably and quietly to hold use occupy possess and enjoy all and singular
the better part of the premises above granted and released and every part thereof
and all the appurtenances and to have receive and take the rents and
revenue and profits thereof to his own particular use and behoof any thing
by the said party herein contained to the contrary hereof in any wise notwithstanding
