Now know all men by these presents that we John C Wait and Jane C Wait his wife doth, the said deceased both of Panola County and State of Mississippi in consideration of five hundred dollars our distributive share of the appraised value of said land being secured to us by James McCullough of the District of Greenville and State of South Carolina have made Bargained sold and released unto these presents do grant, bargain sell and release unto the said James McCullough all the right title and interest which we or either of us have in a certain Tract of Land in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid of South Carolina before referred to herein as the Home Tract wherein the said Joseph McCullough resided at the time of his death containing eleven hundred and fifty seven acres more or less lying on both sides of the Greenville road on the waters of Horse and Mountain Creeks Beginning on a stake 34 and running thence A 20 E 30 to a stake 34 Thence N 75<sup>o</sup> E 36 to a Black oak 34 bounded by lands belonging to the estate of said deceased Thence S 40 E 21 to another stake 34 Thence S 75<sup>o</sup> E 19 50 to a Red oak 34 bounded by Elizabeth Gaines Thence S 28 W 33 30 to a Spanish oak 34 Thence S 44 W 12 75 to a Poplar 34 Thence S 5 E 41 75 to a white oak 34 bounded by lands belonging to said estate Thence N 83 W 87 30 to a stake 34 bounded by H G Johnson Thence S 11 W 77 90 to another stake 34 Thence S 39 E 11 to a stake 34 bounded by Micajah Indian and from hence (the last named corner on a stone rock) Thence down the meanders of said Creek about 47 chains to the mouth of a small branch Thence up the meanders of said branch to the beginning.

Together with all and singular thing the number of instruments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

I do have and to hold all and singular our right title and interest and all the right title and interest of either of us in and to the said premises unto the said James McCullough his heirs and assigns forever. And we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular our right title and interest or distributive share in said premises unto the said James McCullough his heirs and assigns against us and our heirs and every other person lawfully claiming unto to claim the same or any part thereof.
