Grenville District, now by the premises that W B Johnson of the State and a District aforesaid for the consideration of Five hundred dollars to me in hand paid by John T Johnson have
Granted, Bargained sold and Allocated and by the premises do Grant, Release and Release unto John T Johnson a certain Tract or parcel of Land
whereon I now have lying on both sides of the middle fork of Saluda River
by the name of the Mayfield Tract Conveyed by Me first to John S Taylor
by said Taylor to A J Waldrup by Waldrup to P D Johnson and from
Johnson to W B Johnson and by W B Johnson to John T Johnson in
Tract containing one hundred acres more or less a the half of the original
Tract that was sold to me.

Together with all and singular the Rights Member, Successions
and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise incident thereto.
And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, Executrix, Administrators, to
ward and forever defend the same unto John T Johnson his heirs
and assigns from every person or persons whomsoever claiming unto claim
the same at any time of it. Also all my interest in the same that was granted
to said John T Johnson and myself I assign over my right to said John
T Johnson and he is to take it at his own risk.

In witness I have hereunto set my hand and first signed
this the 24th July 1854. Signed and delivered in
