James Jackson Gift

State of South Carolina

Know all men by these presents that I William Jackson of Greenville District and State aforesaid for the good

will and affection which I bear toward my loving son James Jackson ^{I will for one dollar to me & his heirs & assigns & assigns} have given granted sold and released and by these presents do give, grant, sell and release unto the said James Jackson all that land on the south & south west side of a conditional line, Beginning on a White oak corner at the mouth of Sa Wm Jacksons Spring branch thence up sd Spring branch including all its variations to a Deciduous corner, thence a N W direction to a Spanish oak corner, containing by estimation one hundred acres more or less, being situated in Greenville District on the waters of ^{mouth part of} South Tigger river,

To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James Jackson his heirs and assigns forever. And I do here by bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James Jackson from myself, my heirs and from every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. In witness hereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 29th day of December A D 1854
