Tammes as Commissioner of the said Court and by virtue of the said Warrant and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred dollars paid by the said James D. Sherman the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, Bargained Sold and Released unto the said James D. Sherman his heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid on South side of Sammons Mill Creek within of Smith Hatchett Beginning on a white oak on the North bank of said Creek running N 48 W 33 rods to a red oak Thence N 35 W 13 rods to a Red oak Thence S 55 W 3 rods so E to a Stake on James Cockman's back line Thence S 15 E 14 rods so E to a large chestnut Thence a N E course to a small Red oak on James Cockman's old line Thence along said line S 75 E to a Sweet Gum a conditional corner on Gent's old line Thence along said line to Leaswell Barret's corner on a Red oak Thence along said Garrett line to the beginning containing one hundred acres more or less
