these presents may come, I, Peter S Smith of Greenville District in the State of South Carolina, send greeting. Whereas, I am indebted unto William Bird of the City of Charleston in the State above mentioned in the sum of ten thousand dollars good and lawful money, by virtue of a certain judgement I am compelled to him the said William Bird. Now know ye, that the said Peter Smith for and towards the payment and satisfaction of the said monies and for divers other good causes and considerations one thousand more have granted, assigned, bargained, and sold, and by these presents do fully and absolutely grant, assign, bargain and sell unto the said William Bird all and all manner of goods, chattels, debts, moneys, and all other things of me the said Peter S Smith what soever as well real as personal of what kind, nature, or quality, whatsoever to wit, all my right title and interest in and to a certain lot of Land situate on Buncombe Street or road in the Town of Greenville in the State of South Carolina, bounded by the lands of Davide, Swandale, and Thurston & the Buncombe Street or road together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in anywise the said land is now held by Hee Lee Thurston is designated in a bond marked Hee Thurston to Peter S Smith and contains two acres and a half more or less; all my right title and interest in a certain tract or lot of land, situate on a back street parallel to the Pendleton street or road about one half mile from the Court House in the town of Greenville in the State aforesaid formerly belonging to Vardry McBee and by him sold to John Carpenter and by John Carpenter deeded to me the said land is described in a deed from John Carpenter to Peter S Smith and contains two and a half acres more or less, together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances therunto belonging, all my stock on hand consisting of Dry fancy goods, gunnery, twenty five thousand pounds of ice and ten dollars worth of e. s. s. brade & c. and candies, together with all the fixtures and furniture of my store consisting of three show cases, one hanging lamp, one large glass two stoves, six tables, curtains, water cooler, cany jars, bottles, cans, scales, weights &c. crockery, cooking utensils &c. belonging to cooking room, six tenent twelve silver spoons, twelve silver forks, furnace, boiling kettle, five ice cream Churns, one freezer, two barrels of cement, seventy feet of 3/4 inch plank Bake house and bake house utensils and furniture, consisting of sheets, jeans, gerts, bottles, table trough, ice cream cart, benches, tables &c. ^{belonging} all as they now stand and are upon a certain lot belonging to J. D. Beattie in Avenue Street, in the town of Greenville in the State aforesaid, one top horse, one bread cart and harness, and also all my house hold, furniture, consisting of five bedsteads, eight mattresses, one bed press, two wardrobes, two bureaus, one dozen plain bottom chairs, four large chairs, one dozen straw chairs, ^{two small chairs} four iron stands, one clock, five pendul, two carpets, four presses, one large lamp, six small lamps, five looking glasses, four mirror shades, glass Kets, counterpane, sheets &c. of the value of fifty dollars, one settle, one lawn or table, six small tables, three paintings, two plain dining tables
