 or tracts of Land that is a moiety or one half interest in them situated laying and
 being in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid on and near Paris Mountain
 collectively containing eight hundred and ninety one acres more or less
 being in four different tracts the first two are described in a deed of conveyance
 made by J. P. Hudson to T. S. Arthur & C. I. Hascall dated January 16th 1834 as follows
 No 1 beginning on Spanish Oak 3 rods N thence N 45° E 67.75 chains to small black gum
 & S. O. M. thence N 65 W 27.80 chains to pine S. O. M. thence S 50 W 28 chains to Hickory
 & S. O. M. thence S 47 E 27.80 chains to hickory 34 0 M. thence S 10 W 4 chains to small
 nut S. & S. O. M. thence S 55 E 6 1/4 chains to black oak 34 0 M. thence N 24 W 5.36
 chains to pine 34 0 M. thence S 11 E 6 chains to Stake 34 0 M. thence N 45 W 7 chains
 beginning containing One hundred acres more or less No 2 containing 75 acres
 more or less beginning on the same Spanish Oak 34 0 M. thence N 45 W 36.50 chains to chestnut
 & S. O. M. thence N 45 E 28.50 chains to chestnut 34 0 M. thence N 48 E 6.50 chains to cherry 34 0 M. thence
 N 69 W 13 chains to Stake 34 0 M. on buck horn creek there is the meanderings of
 Yulee spring branch to beach of Yulee spring thence N 75 W 6.50 chains to chestnut
 & thence N 45 W 6 chains to small black gum 34 0 M. thence N 45 W 23 chains to the beginning. Also

 acres more or less described as being bounded on the N by Buck horn creek on
 east by No Loveland Land on the S & West by land recently conveyed by J. P. Hudson
 to the above parties, to gather with the entire water power of Buck horn creek
 as it flows along past the above described Land with the privilege to be used
 dated June 24th 1834. To either with all the rights members & hereditaments
 appurtenances to the premises particularly the Tannery & mills & stock belonging
 in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular
 in the moiety or one half interest the said premises unto the said Thomas
 Arthur his heirs and assigns forever and the said Charles I. Hascall do
 hereby bind myself & each and every of my heirs & assigns jointly and
 severally to warrant and forever defend the said moiety of the said premises
 Tannery, Mill & Stock appertaining at any time granted unto the said
 Thomas S. Arthur his heirs and assigns forever provided always nevertheless
 and it is the true intent and meaning of the parties to these presents that
 the said Charles I. Hascall do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be
 paid unto the said Arthur the said debt or sum of money with lawful
 interest thereon annually according to the true intent of the said bond
 and condition thereon that this deed of conveyance bargain and sale shall
 cease determine and be utterly null and void or else otherwise
