Stone during her natural life free from all liabilities or account of my debts and contracts with remainder to the child or children of my said wife issue of her present marriage leaving at her death and if she shall die leaving no such issue at her death then the said Slaves Harrietta with her future issue and increase Leah with her future issue and increase and Scott to revert to me or my heirs Executors or administrators free from all Trust
