Know all men by these presents as follows
Whereas Macey Morris of Newberry District South Carolina did many years ago sell and convey to said Gloucester a free man of color of said District a negro girl named Emily & her child Nancy Elizabeth the daughter of the said Freeman Lister and Whereas the said Jesse Gloucester did sell and convey the said Emily & child or children to James Gordon a Free man of color her husband. And Whereas the said James Gordon did sell & convey the said Emily his wife & seven children to me William W. Morris of Newberry for and in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred & Seventy Six dollars in order to protect the said Emily and children. Now know ye that I the said William W. Morris for and in consideration of the sum of Eight Hundred & twenty two Dollars to me in hand paid by Perry & Duncan of Greenville District South Carolina have bargained sold and conveyed and by these presents do grant bargain sell convey and deliver unto the said Perry & Duncan Judge John B. O'Neal and Genl James H. Williams the said negro woman Emily the wife of James Gordon a free man of color and her eight children named as follows (viz) Nancy Elizabeth Polly Octavia John Jesse Daniel Brooks Douglas Adaiak Jeromy or James and an infant child not yet named To have and to hold the said Emily and her eight children above named unto the said Perry & Duncan Judge John B. O'Neal and James H. Williams and minor heirs forever upon the following conditions. The said Perry & Duncan is first to be repaid the money he has advanced to me out of the hire services or wages of the said negroes with interest thereon from this date, or he is to be repaid the same by the said James Gordon a free man of color has bond of the said Emily and father of all her said children above named. Then the said Perry & Duncan John B. O'Neal and Genl James H. Williams to have and to hold the said Emily & her children above mentioned to them and their heirs so as to let them enjoy as much of their time and labor as is consistent with the laws of South Carolina and to treat them justly and honorably and see that they are all and each of them provided for and protected under the laws of this State and not reduced to want and suffering. And I the said William W. Morris do hereby warrant and forever defend the said Emily and her children to slaves unto the said Perry & Duncan John B. O'Neal and Genl James H. Williams their heirs against me and my heirs and all other persons claiming or attempting to claim the same or any of them for the uses and purposes above mentioned. The said Emily and her children and the descendants of the female, at all times paying them in labor or money all the expences which they or any of their heirs may incur in taxes or other matters for the benefit or on account of the said Emily and her children or the descendants of the female.
