Lynch of the District and State aforesaid do by this instrument of writing or Declaration of Trust in consideration of natural love and affection and in the further consideration of Ten Dollars to me in hand paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged testify actual wledge make known and declar. that I hold the following negro Slaves to wit Harriett a woman about thirty five years of age and her seven children James Martha Cinda Rhode Peter Milly and Millie also a girl named Darcus about fifteen years of age another girl Leah about thirteen years of age and a boy named John about twelve years of age together with the future increase & issue of the said negroes also the following other property One Piano a young Wagon and Two Bed Steads with Beds & Bedding for the same in trust to and for the sole separate and exclusive use of my daughter Eliza Jane Crittenden wife of S. Stanley Crittenden also of the District & State aforesaid during the life of my said daughter free from the debts contracts or liability of her present or any future husband and at the death of my said daughter to go to her children Shan and Shan alike the issue of a deceased child to represent the parent and in case of her dying without children to her lawful heirs. I the said Henry O. Lynch to have

power and authority whenever I may deem it advisable for the interest of my said daughter and with her written consent or request to sell any of the aforesaid negroes or other property settled by this Declaration of Trust and reinvest the same in real or personal property to the same uses and on the same trust as are therein created and the said Negroes and other property herein before mentioned are held by me in trust as aforesaid free from all liability on account of my individual debts contracts or agreements. The State of South Carolina To all to whom these presents shall come I D. Hoke Sheriff of Greenville District

and State aforesaid send greeting. Whereas by virtue of a writ of Fieri Facias issued out of the Court of Common Pleas held for the District of Greenville tested the twenty ninth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four at the suit of James Brackenridge Deaver to me commanding me that of the goods and chattels lands and tenements of William Huller to levy the sum of Nine Hundred & Seventy Six dollars & fifty five cents damages and cost I have seized and taken of the lands and tenements of the said William Huller all that certain piece parcel and tract of land containing three hundred and fifty (more or less) acres situate and being in the District of Greenville adjoining lands of H. H. Huller McKinney and others lying on the State Road about nineteen miles from Greenville Court House and whereas the said premises with their appurtenances since the seizure by me made by virtue of the said writ of Fieri Facias before mentioned have been exposed to sale at public vendue and purchased by H. H. Huller of the Greenville District for the sum of Twenty Five Hundred Dollars being the highest sum that was bidden therefor. Now know ye that I David Hoke Sheriff aforesaid by virtue of the said writ of Fieri Facias aforesaid to me directed and delivered as aforesaid and by virtue of the Statute in such cases made and provided and for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty Five Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid or secured to be paid by the said H.
