Shumate Negroes South Carolina Know all men by Greenville District these presents that of Clarinda McCullough of the State and District aforesaid in consideration of my friends J. B. Roberts & J. S. Shumate and L. H. Shumate at my special request having gone my security to Samuel A. Lowmes Commissioner in Equity for Greenville District on two Guardianship Bonds for two thousand dollars each dated the thirteenth of July 1858 to secure the legacies of my minor children Charles McCullough and John W. McCullough and in consideration of five dollars to me paid by the said J. B. Roberts & J. S. Shumate and L. H. Shumate the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said J. B. Roberts & J. S. Shumate and L. H. Shumate the following named negro slaves to wit, Hanny aged twenty two years Henry four years Comy three years and Julius three months to have and to hold all and singular the said negro slaves unto the said J. B. Roberts & J. S. Shumate and L. H. Shumate their Executors administrators and assigns to their sole use forever. Provided nevertheless that if the said Clarinda McCullough her Executors or administrators shall well and truly pay unto the said Commissioner in Equity or his successors in office the aforesaid two Bonds of two thousand dollars each dated as aforesaid the 13th July 1858, or so conduce as to keep the said J. B. Roberts & J. S. Shumate and L. H. Shumate harmless for their said undertaking then this conveyance shall be void otherwise to remain in full force and effect, and provided also that until default by them and Clarinda McCullough her Executors or administrators in the

performance of the condition aforesaid it shall and may be lawful for her or them to keep possession of the said granted property and to use and enjoy the same. In testimony whereof I the said Clarinda McCullough have hereunto set my hand and seal this the eighteenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight. Dec 15th 1840 Excepting the one hundred & one half acres conveyed to us aforesaid also all that tract parcel & lot of land situate in the same district & State adjoining the tract aforesaid lying on the Rutherford Road near the town of Greenville, containing ten and one half acres and adjoining also land of Mr Stall & a lot formerly belonging to Dr J.
