Know all men by these presents that I James McKinney of the State and District aforesaid for and in consideration of Two Hundred dollars to me in hand paid by James W Johnson Sen of Greenville District and State aforesaid have granted bargain sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said James W Johnson Sen a certain piece or parcel of land situated lying and being in Greenville District and State aforesaid on the head waters of Mush Creek and bounded as follows, beginning at a Cherry on the Road thence N 37 W ch to a Black 3+ thence N 62 W 23 ch 25 L to a Chestnut oak 3+ thence N 40 E 20 ch to a Black Jack 3+ thence N 68 E 16 ch 75 L to a Stake 3+ thence S 62 E 21 ch to Red oak at the road then with the road to the beginning containing Seventy Nine Acres be the same more or less, to have and to hold the above granted premises unto the said James W Johnson his heirs and assigns forever, together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining and I the said James McKinney do hereby bind my self my heirs executors and assigns for ever to warrant and defend the said premises to the said James W Johnson his heirs and assigns against my self my heirs and assigns and against any every other person or persons lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof

on a note of hand for the sum of Two hundred dollars due January the 14th 1860. Now know ye that for and in consideration of the said Oliver W Barrett standing my security to the said James A McCarter I do hereby assign unto the said Oliver W Barrett as collateral security, as my indorser on said note all my interest right title and claim in all and singular the real estate of Mary Taylor deceased or as much thereof as may save the said Oliver W Barrett harmless and free from all liability as my indorser and let it be distinctly understood by and between the parties that the above assignment is to extend no further than to secure the said Oliver W Barrett harmless as my security to the said James A McCarter and whereas the said Elizabeth Payne shall pay or cause to be paid the said sum of Two hundred dollars and the interest thereon then this assignment is null and void But should the said Oliver W Barrett his executors administrators or they become liable to pay the said Note to James A McCarter then and in that case I do hereby authorize and empower him to sue for demand and receive from any and all persons in whose hands my said interest may be or so much as will save him harmless from all liability as my indorser on the note to the said James A McCarter for two hundred dollars
