

Henry L Davis Deed South Carolina
 To For Land Greenville District
 Jacob Ponder

Know all men by these presents that I Henry L Davis of the State and District for an Inconsideration of Twenty five dollars to me in hand paid by Jacob Ponder of the District of Greenville and State of South Carolina have bargained sold and released unto Jacob Ponder a tract or parcel of Land supposed to be three Acres be the same more or less it being a part of the Zilmansmith tract when on he lived and died lying on the South side of the Big Branch beginning at the mouth of Henry Davis Spring branch thence up the branch to a pine hence a straight line to the upper end of the bridge a cross Sugar River thence up the river to a black gum thence to a chestnut stump thence up the meanders of the Big Branch to the beginning corner. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said land and premises belonging or in anywise appertaining therunto to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Jacob Ponder his heirs and assigns and I do hereby bind my self my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Jacob Ponder his heirs and assigns against myself and all other persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

Know all men by the presents that I J R Bowden for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to me in hand paid have granted bargained sold and released unto David Willard of Spartanburg District and State of South Carolina a certain tract or lot of Land lying and situated in Greenville District State of South Carolina beginning on a chestnut on the side of the Road leading from Road towards Rutherfordton Via Dr W A Mooney and running due North Six 6 chains 91 Links to a stone on side of the Road thence due West three 3 chains 4 5/2 links to a Red oak thence due South Six 6 chains 91 Links to a Red Oak thence due east x thence 3 chains 4 5/2 Links to the beginning containing two acres more or less together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said David Willard his heirs and assigns for ever and I do hereby bind my self my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said David Willard his heirs and assigns against me my heirs or any other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
