

represented by the plat hereto annexed made by John Watson Deputy Surveyor dated the 24th day of December 1846 containing twelve hundred and eighty acres more or less situateing in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid on the west side of Grove Creek and east side of Saluda River and between those water courses and has such shape boundaries and marks as the said Plat represents being the same tract of land Jeremiah Cleveland by his last will and testament devised to my farther R M Cleveland and the same tract of land the said R M Cleveland by deed dated the 13th day of January 1846 conveyed to the said J J Cleveland and me jointly to have and to hold all and singular the one half of the tract of land and premises mentioned and described in the said Plat unto the said J J Cleveland and his heirs forever. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said one half of said tract of land belonging or in anyway incident or appertaining. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors administrators and assigns to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises above mentioned and conveyed unto the said J J Cleveland and his heirs forever against me and my heirs Executors administrators and assigns and against all and every other or persons whomsoever claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
