 To For Know all men by these presents
 Manly Bright Land That I James Wilson of Greenville
 District in the aforesaid State

in consideration of one hundred dollars to me in hand
 paid by Manly Bright of Greenville District in the
 State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and
 released and by these presents do grant bargain
 sell and release unto the said Manly Bright a certain
 piece or parcel of Land situate in Greenville District
 and State aforesaid on both sides of a Branch of Frohawk's
 Creek of South Syger River being part of the tract of Land
 whose I now live originally granted to William D Thomas
 Beginning at a Persimmon \times on the South bank of a branch
 and runs N 62 W 1.50 to a Red oak \times dead and down originally
 Grant corner thence S 21 W 19.58 to a Stone \times thence N 85 E 17.73
 to a Forked Persimmon \times \times \times thence N 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 18.67 to the beginning
 corner containing Fourteen acres more or less. Together
 with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments
 and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any
 wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all
 and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said
 Manly Bright his heirs and assigns forever and I do
 hereby bind my self my heirs executors and administrators
 to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said
 premises unto the said Manly Bright his heirs and assigns
 against me and my heirs and against every other person
 or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or
 any part thereof
