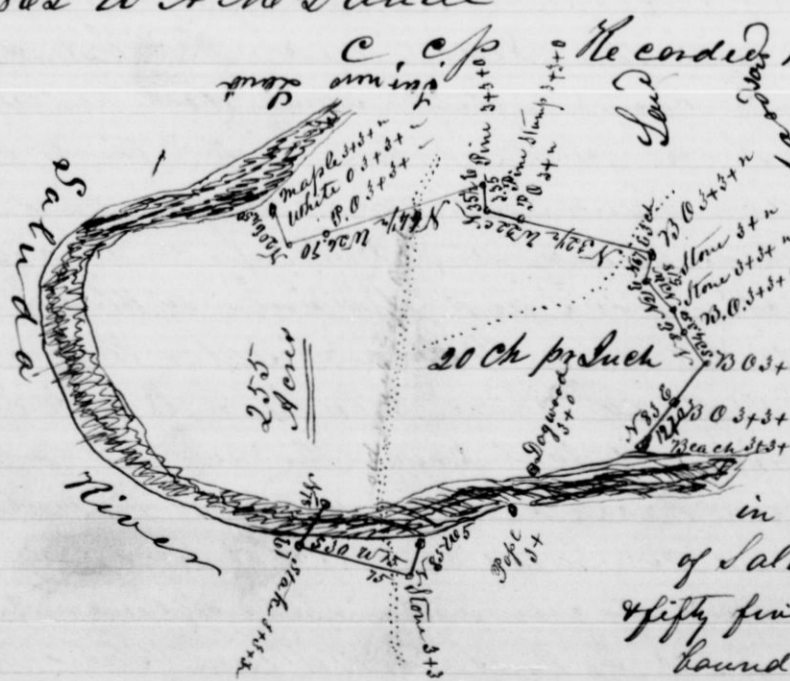

Together with all and singular the hereditaments rights members and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Land belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the reversions and remainders rents issues and profits thereof, and also all the estate right title Interest dower Possession property benefit claim and demand whatsoever both at Law and Equity of the Heirs and representatives of the said Silas H Turner and of the parties to this suit and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof, by from or under them or either of them, to have and to hold the said Land with its hereditaments privileges and appurtenances unto the said William Bates Thomas Mc Cox and Henry P Hammett and their heirs and assigns to them and their only poster use benefit and behoof forever
