State by a seal note for said amount payable in one year from
date and bearing equal date with this mortgage with interest from
the date of a copy of which seal note is indorsed on this mortgage
and being desirous of securing said note and the payment of the
said sixteen hundred dollars to the said William M Thomas Esquire
for and in consideration of these presents and the sum of one dollar
to me in hand paid upon the delivery of these presents the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged do grant bargain sell alien convey and
confirm to the said William M Thomas Esquire his heirs and assigns forever
all that tract or parcel of land situate in Greenville District in this
State containing One Hundred and fifty acres more or less on the Ruth
Rutherford and Chicks Springs Roads adjoining lands of Miles Southern
and others and more particularly described in the deed from
Miles Southern to Eliza Clary dated 19th day of July 1861 and recor-
ded in the office of the Clerk of the Court of Greenville District
in Book 3 and on page 177 and 178 thereof together with all and
singular the Rights members hereditaments and appurtenances
therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining to have and to
hold the same to him the said William M Thomas Esquire his heirs
and assigns forever, Provided always nevertheless and it is the true
intent and meaning of these presents that if the said C H Talbert
shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid the said sixteen hundred
with the interest accruing thereon according to the ~~true~~ intent and
meaning of the note above described according to the terms thereof
hereafter these presents are to be utterly null and void, and it is
herewith understood that until default of payment is made the said
C H Talbert are to use enjoy and hold the said Premises
