 This Indenture made the Eighth
 day of October in the year of
 our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty one, between
 B N Campbell Esquire Commissioner of the Honorable Court of
 Equity for Laurens District at Laurens Court House in the
 said State of the one part and James M Sullivan of the other
 part, Whereas John C Sullivan and others on or about the
 twenty seventh day of September in the year of our Lord
 One thousand eight hundred and fifty exhibited their bill of
 complaint in the Court of Equity at Laurens Court House in
 the said State against Hewlett Sullivan Jr and others. Shewing that Hewlett
 Sullivan the father of complainant late of Greenville District
 and State aforesaid on 21st day of August Anno Domini 1829 executed
 his last will and testament and afterwards on the 11th day of July
 1830 departed this life leaving the said will unrevoked and
 in full force, that by the second clause of said will the testator
 amongst other things devised the tract of land whereon he
 resided in Greenville District on Keedy River to Mary Sullivan
 his widow during her life and at her death to be equally divided
 amongst his heirs, that said widow has since died intestate, and
 the land is subject to partition amongst the said heirs at Law
 of the said testator according to the provisions of said will
 and the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court came
 on to be heard at June Term in the year of our Lord one thousand
 eight hundred and fifty one when the said Court after full
 hearing and mature deliberation in the premises did order
 adjudge and decree that the tract of land below described
 should be sold at Public Auction by the Commissioner of the
 said Court on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in
 their decretal order as by reference thereto in the Registry
 of the said Court will appear, and the said B N Campbell
 as Commissioner of the said Court after having duly advertised
 the said tract of land for sale by public outcry on the Eighth
