 any person or person whomsoever renounce release and forever
 relinquish unto the within named George W Center and
 Dicy Center their heirs and assigns all her estate interest
 and inheritance in all and singular the premises within
 mentioned and released

 for an inconsideration of the sum of Four Hundred Eighty
 four dollars to me in hand paid by George W Center of
 the aforesaid State and District aforesaid the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged and for an inconsideration
 of the sum herein bargained sold and released unto
 the said George W Center a certain tract or parcel of Land
 beginning on white oak 3⁴ near a low gap on the side of a
 road and runs No 24^{1/2} E 16.00 to hickory at the mouth of
 a small branch when it enters into Morgans Creek thence
 S 28. E 31 chs to a stone in a field Spanish oak gone, thence S 18
 E 20. ch to a chestnut, thence S 076 W 74.79 to a black oak on the
 Road thence S 18^{1/2} W 6 chs 75 links to a stone by a 3 prong chestnut
 oak thence S 67 W 23 chs 35 links to a persimmon at head of a hollow
 thence down said hollow and branch to the mouth or to the
 intersection of another branch thence N 71^{3/4} E 29 chains 17
 links to the beginning - containing one hundred and twenty
