

Crittenden, of the District and State aforesaid, and in further
 consideration of the sum of ten dollars to me paid by the said Eliza
 Lane Crittenden, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do
 hereby testify acknowledge declare and make known that I have
 and hold the following described negro slaves and land in trust
 for my said daughter Eliza Lane Crittenden (wife of S. Lang
 Crittenden), to and upon the uses terms limitations and
 conditions hereinafter set forth, that is to say three negro slaves
 to wit Rachel aged twenty four years and her two children
 Wiley aged five years and Robert aged two years, and the
 future increase and issue of the said slaves and all that
 piece parcel and tract of land containing one hundred
 and three acres more or less, situate lying and being on
 Richland Creek and the North fork thereof, in the District
 and State aforesaid adjoining lands of Croft Chaplin and
 Thompson and having the following lines meters and bounds
 to wit beginning at a stake at the junction of Richland
 Creek with the north fork thereof, and running thence up
 said north fork to W. A. Stump 34 thence N 30 W 5.75 to a corner
 34 thence N 11 E 20.40 to a P. O. Stump 34 thence N 20 W 10.50 to a
 stake in field, thence N 30 W 17.50 to a stake in old road, thence
 S 85 W 7.56 to a R. O. 34 thence S 71 W 3 to a sweet gum, thence S.
 E 6.50 to a corner, thence W 50 links to a corner, thence S 50.50
 to a stake, thence to a stake, thence across Richland Creek
 to a stake at Thompsons land, and thence with Thompson
 land to the beginning corner to wit, in trust for and to
 the sole separate and exclusive use benefit and behoof
 of my said daughter Eliza Lane Crittenden for and
 during the term of her natural life free from the
 debts contracts and liabilities of her present or any
 future husband, and at the death of my said daughter
 then in trust to go to her children share and share
 alike, the issue of a deceased child to represent the
 parent and in the event of her dying without children
 then to go to her lawful heir, and in trust further
 that I the said Henry E. Lynch shall have power and
 authority whenever I may deem it advisable for the
 interest of my said daughter, and with her written
 consent or request to sell any portion or all of the aforesaid
 slaves or land and to reinvest the proceeds thereof in other real
 or personal property to and upon the same uses and trusts as
 are herein created, and I do further declare that the said
 slaves and land hereinbefore mentioned, are held by me in
 trust as aforesaid free from all liability on account of my
 individual debts contracts or agreements *
