 of seven thousand dollars to us paid by John W Grady and Samuel
 Brown of the District and State aforesaid, have granted bargained sold
 and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release
 unto the said John W Grady and Samuel Brown all that certain piece
 parcel and tract of land situate and being in the District of Greenville
 and State aforesaid on both sides of Rocky Creek waters of Broad River
 and known as the Paper Mill Tract containing about Sixty Five acres
 more or less Beginning at the mouth of the Long Branch and running
 thence south 70 East ten chains to a stake at the wagon Road, thence
 south along said Road two chains and Twenty five links to a stake & thence
 south 70 East through the Richards Tract of Land to a corner & on the
 Mahaffey Branch which divides it from said Mahaffey's Land, thence
 down the meanders of said Branch to the creek thence down the
 meanders of the creek to a maple & when there is now a bridge
