Devenport in consideration of the aforesaid debt of five hundred and seventy five dollars with its interest to the said William De Pool his executor administrators and assigns hath granted bargain sold released and conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell unto the said William De Pool his heirs and assigns all that plantation or tract of land containing as above named 122 acres more or less situated in the District aforesaid and lying on the waters of Rudy river beginning on a sweet gum 34 in the fork of a branch and Little Hoover Creek running thence up said branch 355-10-390 to a Red oak 34 thence N 3 W 1.00 to a Red oak 34 binding on Mc Mc Arnold. Thence N 74 W 4.00 to a post oak 34 thence 10 W 87 1/2 to a Sweet gum 34 thence S 28 W 8.00 to a stake 34 thence 20 W 4.45 to a Maple 34 on the branch and binding on S Mc Waser. Thence up the main division of the Spring branch S 6 24.50 to a white oak 34 at the head of said branch thence S 33 E 9.25 to a post oak 34 bounded by the estate land of W B Browning thence N 7 1/2 E 35.00 to a white oak 34 on the Lawrence line thence N 40 W 41.00 to the beginning corner together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever thereto and belonging and in anywise pertaining. To have and to hold the said plantation or tract of land hereditaments hereby granted with the appurtenances unto the said William De Pool his heirs and assigns forever provided always nevertheless that if the said W B Devenport his heirs executors or administrators shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said William De Pool his executor administrators or assigns the aforesaid debt of five hundred and seventy five dollars on the day and time herein before mentioned and appointed for the payment thereof with the interest on the same. Now it is hereby expressly understood and agreed to that if the said William B. Devenport fails to pay the said note and interest above mentioned then the said William De Pool is hereby authorized and empowered to sell the same or said plantation or tract of land by the Sheriff of Greenville District he giving twenty one days notice thereof on the first sale day thereafter and to pay the amount of the said note and interest to the said William De Pool and if any surplus to the said William B. Know all men by these presents that I Frances Groce and William Deunt law of Greenville District and in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of the love and good will we have to the Christian Religion and especially to the Baptist denomination. We have given granted bargain and released and by these presents do give grant bargain and release unto William Madkins of Pickens District and O P Phillips of Greenville District both of late aforesaid Trustees in Trust for Berea Church and their successors in office a certain piece parcel or Lot of Land containing four acres and fourteen Poles Situated in the State and District aforesaid on a Branch of Saluda River and in and around Berea Church. Beginning at White oak 34 on the Road leading from Pickens District to Greenville Court House by way of Horns Mill. Thence N 55 1/2 W 30 to Rock 34 on thence S 33 1/4 W 6.75 ch to Rock 34 on thence S 57 1/2 E 2.35 ch to Rock 34 on thence S 40 1/4 W 4.30 to White oak 34 54 0 m on branch thence S 36 1/2 E 1.25 ch to Spanish oak 34 on near the Spring that belongs to said Church thence N 49 1/4 E 9.45 ch to Rock 34 on in said Road leading from Pickens District to Greenville Court House thence N 28 W 5.35 ch along said road to the beginning White oak 34 0 m together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.
