Obediah Devenport	Land		Know all men by these presents that we Irvin Devenport Francis Devenport and Isaac Devenport of the State and District aforesaid have sold at public outcry to Obediah Devenport for the sum of four hundred and thirty Dollars in Gold a certain tract or parcel of land situated in the State and District aforesaid containing one hundred and ninety six acres more or less which formerly was the property of Francis Devenport & now deceased having been deeded to him for life by his father William Devenport the same being on waters of Horse Creek of Beede River it being the plantation on which Francis Devenport & Land and deed beginning on A. R. O. 34 on lands formerly belonging to Jonathan Seecrest thence thence running N 85 1/2 E 42 to a P. O. 34 thence N 86 25 to above thence N 88 1/4 E 17 75 to a P. O. 34 thence N 70 E 24 50 to a line 34 thence N 5 W 26 25 to a stone 34 thence N 85 W 12 to a P. O. 34 thence N 57 W 20 50 to a pine 34 thence S 24 W 81 50 to the beginning containing as before mentioned one hundred and ninety six a cre more or less. To have and to hold all and singular the said premises above mentioned unto the said Obediah Devenport forever and we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises to the said Obediah Devenport his heirs and assigns against ourselves and our heirs and against any person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof We would state in the conclusion of this deed of conveyance that Francis Devenport died having seven children viz William Devenport Irvin Devenport Francis Devenport Obediah Devenport Vincent Devenport Reuben Devenport and D P Devenport two of whom viz Vincent & D P Devenport removed to California several years ago and one viz Reuben Devenport died previous to his father Francis Devenport and further more state that we only received each of us two our seventh of the amount for which the land was sold
