George W. Bragg Lien The State of South Carolina  
 To on Greenville County  
 J. M. Croswell Crop This Indenture entered into between J. M.  
 Croswell of the County of Greenville in the

State aforesaid, of the one part, and George W. Bragg of the County  
 and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that whereas the said  
 J. M. Croswell as aforesaid have by these presents agreed to make  
 advances to the said George W. Bragg for agricultural purposes not  
 to exceed seventy five Dollars during the year one thousand eight  
 hundred and seventy. Now the said George W. Bragg, hereby agrees to give  
 unto the said J. M. Croswell as aforesaid a Lien for the amount which  
 shall be so advanced with the interest thereon at the rate of ten per centum per  
 annum on all the crops of whatsoever description he may grow or cause to be  
 grown during the year aforesaid on the farm or plantation of the said Peter &  
 Sudduth in the County and State aforesaid in accordance with the act of  
 the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina entitled and act to them  
 advances for agricultural purposes not to exceed the twentieth day of September  
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six, and  
 it is further agreed by and between the parties as aforesaid, by these  
 presents, that the said George W. Bragg for himself his executors adm-  
 inistrators and assigns, does hereby consent promise and agree to and with  
 the said J. M. Croswell as aforesaid, that all the crops of whatsoever description  
 reared and grown by him shall not be removed from his said farm or plan-  
 tation without the written consent of the said J. M. Croswell as aforesaid  
 and that if the aforesaid amount of advances, as aforesaid shall not well  
 and truly be paid by or before the first of December next, it shall and may  
 be lawful for the said J. M. Croswell as aforesaid or the survivor of them  
 if either of them should die before that date and at any time after the  
 first of December next, peaceably and quietly to enter into any or  
 all the messuages, lands or tenements of the said George W. Bragg &  
 to take into their custody, or the custody of the survivor of them  
 if either should die, and the same to hold and detain to their  
 own use and behoof, so that they may sell and dispose of said crops  
 of whatsoever description at their pleasure, returning the overplus  
 if any should happen to be after paying off the above mentioned sum unto  
 themselves, the said J. M. Croswell as aforesaid unto the said George  
 Bragg his executors administrators or assigns
