Harris for agricultural purposes not to exceed seventy five Dollars during the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy three the said H. W. Harris have by agreement unto the said William W. Williams as aforesaid and for the amount which shall be so advanced with the interest thereon at the rate of five per centum per annum on all the crops of whatsoever description he may grow or cause to be grown during the year aforesaid on the farms or plantations Mrs Mary C. Beeco in the County and State aforesaid in accordance with the act of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina entitled an act to secure advances for agricultural purposes ratified the twentieth day of September in the year of our lords one thousand eight hundred and sixty six and it is further agreed by and between the parties as aforesaid by these presents that the said H. W. Harris for himself his Executors administrators and assigns does hereby consent promise and agree to and with the said William W. Williams as aforesaid that all the crops of whatsoever description reaped and grown by him shall not be removed from his said farms or plantations without the written consent of the said William W. Williams as aforesaid and that if the aforesaid amount of advances as aforesaid shall not well and truly be paid by or before the first of November next it shall and may be lawful for the said William W. Williams as aforesaid or the survivor of them if either of them should die before that date and at any time after the 1st day of November next peaceably and quietly to enter into any or all the messuages lands of the messuages of lands works by the said H.
