 Known all men by these presents that J. James Lenderman of Greenville County in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of twenty five Dollars to me paid by W. M. Lenderman & John S. Ashmore of Greenville County in the State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and release and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said W. M. Lenderman & John S. Ashmore Henry Harris James Cox James Moon W. A. Pepper W. J. West and P. D. Huff (Trustees) a certain Tract or lot of Land situate and lying in the County and State above named well of the Principal Ruddy Fork creek as described as follows Beginning at a well 34 on the N. 41 3/4 E 9.75 ch to Rock 15 on the S. 22 1/2 E 8.45 ch to Rock 37 on the west 16.45 ch to the Beginning for the use and purpose of a well for a school house lot for the benefit of the white population which will be controlled by a magus appointed in said school that the said James Lenderman having given one acre & one eighth free of charge on condition that the trustees do not interfere with any religious meetings or Sunday School that may be held in said school House by the white population of said neighborhood containing three and five eighths together with all and singular the rights members Hereditaments and appertinances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to hold and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said W. M. Lenderman J. S. Ashmore Henry Harris James Cox James Moon W. A. Pepper W. J. West and P. D. Huff and their Successors forever And I do hereby bind myself and my heirs executors & administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Trustees and their Successors against me and my heirs and every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same on any part thereof Witness my hand and seal this 9th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one and in the ninth fifth year of the sovereignty and independence of the United States of America

Trammell each of the State and County aforesaid do give and bequeath a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the State and County aforesaid on the banks waters of Sugar River bounded by lands of Remond Dill Oliver Trammell David Davis & William Trammell containing fifty acres more or less one half to the said Maden J. Williams & the other half to the said Merida W. Trammell Reserving the same for my own use and benefit during my natural life Together with all and singular the above named premises unto the said Maden J. Williams & Merida W. Trammell to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Maden J. Williams & Merida W. Trammell their heirs assigns forever and I do hereby bind my self my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Maden J. Williams & Merida W. Trammell Their heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and every other person lawfully claiming or claim the same or any part thereof I also give and bequeath to Maden J. Williams one Hitter Red oil one spinning wheel one Cuckoo one Reel I also give and bequeath to Merida W. Trammell one Table one side Road one chest & one round lid
