Moore will pay him for all the repairing what is right out of the rent of the place also the plot of the place is bound for tax for the land And J. J. Mitchell as agree to clear all the bottom on the branch joining M Mitchell land to clear fence and ditch it And Joseph A Moore do give unto the said J. J. Mitchell all his own make for three year on all the land he clear and fence after he is paid for clearing and ditching the said Mitchell is to pay one third of the grain made on the bottom the more on the land now in cultivation and on the bottom to repair at the same time I agreed to and signed in the presence of the November 10<sup>th</sup> 1870
