The State of South Carolina  
Whereas on the eighteenth  
day of May A D 1874  
Emma M Westfield and Whitner Symmes Plaintiffs  
exhibited their complaint for relief, &c in the Court of  
Common Pleas for the County of Greenville and State  
aforesaid against Thomas M Cox Thomas L Gover and  
others Defendants wherein amongst other things it was alleged  
that one John Westfield now deceased on the day of  
A D 1873 sold and conveyed to the Plaintiff Whitner Symmes  
and Thomas M Cox and Thomas L Gover the Defendants  
and to one James Pimm also now deceased and undivided  
four fifths interest in and to certain real Estate in and around  
the City of Greenville in the County of Greenville and State  
aforesaid and more particularly described in the Deed  
of Conveyance of that date; and on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of September  
A D 1873 the said John Westfield agreed to sell the firm  
of Cox Pimm & Co (which was composed of himself and  
other parties last above mentioned) certain other lots  
pieces or parcels of land in and near the said City of  
Greenville and County and State aforesaid and were particular-  
ly described in said agreement and that the said parties  
who were interested in the lands above mentioned in order  
to facilitate the said sale and transfer of said lands had  
agreed to and amongst themselves to convey all of the  
said lands in trust to two of their number to sell and divide  
the proceeds of same amongst the parties according to their  
respective interests and prayed amongst other things that these  
matters might be inquired into and if found admissible to  
carry out the said agreement in reference to a Trust deed  
that a suitable Trust deed be reported together with some  
suitable person or persons to act as trustee or trustees and  
whereas upon the said cause being heard on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of  
June A D 1874 it was referred to a Special referee to  
report on the various matters embraced in the pleadings in  
said cause being heard on the 17 day of June A D 1874 it  
was referred to a Special referee to report on the various mat-  
ters embraced in the pleadings in said cause and upon the  
report of the said Special referee coming in containing the  
various recommendations therein more fully set forth  
it was on the 7 day of August A D 1874 amongst other things  
ordered that Whitner Symmes and Thomas L Gover be  
appointed Trustees to whom William A M Daniel Clerk  
of the said Court should convey the said lands To have and to  
hold the same to for and upon the purposes uses and trusts  
as set forth and declared in the Deeds reported by the said  
Referee and whereas the said William A M Daniel Clerk  
aforesaid did convey the lands mentioned in the pleadings  
to the said Trustees Now therefore know all men by these  
present that we Thomas L Gover and Whitner Symmes

on us in and by the order of the Trust Deed aforesaid and in  
performance of our duty as such Trustees and also in con-  
sideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty four Dollars  
and fifty four cents being balance of fourteen hundred and fifty  
Dollars to us paid by John Burdine before the delivery of these  
presents have granted bargained sold and released and by these  
presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John  
Burdine all that piece parcel or lot of land being parcel of the  
lands above mentioned bargained and sold to the said John Bur-  
dine on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of April A D 1873 situate and lying within  
the Corporate limits of the City of Greenville in the County and  
State aforesaid between John and West Streets and containing  
five and three eighths of One Acre (5<sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>) more or less and having  
such shapes metes buttings and boundings as are represented  
by a plat of said lot made by J P Johnson and hereto attached  
The said Burdine having also paid for one half of the short  
Street lying east of said lot and connecting the said John and  
West Streets together with all and singular the rights mem-  
bers hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said premises belonging  
or in anywise incident or appertaining To have and to hold all  
and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John  
Burdine his heirs and Assigns forever freed from and  
discharged of all further trusts whatever And we do hereby  
bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators to warrant  
and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto  
the said John Burdine his heirs and assigns against us and our  
heirs and every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to  
claim the same or any part thereof by through or under us as  
Trustees aforesaid Witness our hands and seals this twenty ninth  
day of September in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight  
hundred and seventy four and in the Ninety eighth year of the  
Independence of the United States of America Signed
