Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Perry J. Harrison, his heirs and assigns forever. Provided always and these presents are upon this special trust of confidence and upon this express condition; that he the said Perry J. Harrison, his heirs, executors administrators and assigns shall and do permit and suffer me the said James Harrison and my wife Margaret Harrison to use, keep and enjoy a good and sufficient support and maintenance out of the proceeds, rents, issues and income of the said tract of land before mentioned during the term of our natural lives, and that from and after my decease and the death of my wife Margaret Harrison, be the said Perry J. Harrison, his heirs, executors administrators or assigns, shall or lawfully may have hold and enjoy the said premises and every part and parcel thereof; and dispose thereof, and convert the same to his and their own proper use and behoof, as he or they shall think fit.
