that I Henrietta Shockley of

State and County aforesaid for

and in consideration of One hundred and seven and fifty  
cents Dollars to me in hand paid by Grobridge and Nesbit of  
said State and County do grant bargain sell and release and  
by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the  
said Grobridge and Nesbit a small piece parcel or tract of  
land lying being and situate in State and County on branches  
Saluda River bounded by lands of the said Henrietta Shockley  
and the said Grobridge and Nesbit and Robert Roasmund  
beginning on a stone 3x on the Williamston Road thence  
Road like to a stone 3x in the above said road thence N 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ <sup>o</sup>  
W 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ <sup>o</sup> to a stone 3x near the Golden Grove Chapel thence S 85 $\frac{1}{4}$ <sup>o</sup>  
E 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ <sup>o</sup> to the beginning stone 3x containing One and three fourths  
acres be the same more or less Together with all and  
singular the rights members hereditaments appurtenances  
appertaining or in anywise incident to the above described  
land, I bind myself my heirs executors adm<sup>r</sup> and  
assigns to warrant and forever defend all and singular  
of the above described land unto the said Grobridge and  
Nesbit to them and to their heirs and assigns forever against  
myself my heirs executors adm<sup>r</sup> and assigns and against  
any person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming  
or to claim the same or any part thereof
