the sealing of these presents by Fannie & Harris of Greenville  
county in the State aforesaid (the receipt whereof is hereby ack-  
nowledged) have granted bargained sold and released, and by these  
presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Fannie &  
Harris all that lot of land containing eight acres, two rods and  
thirteen perches, lying on the East side of Augusta Street in the  
city of Greenville, and bounded by said Augusta Street, the lands  
of Thomas Thurston, of the Furman University and by another lot of  
land belonging to me, being the same lot of land described and  
conveyed in a deed from J. Whiteford Smith Trustee of Mrs  
Susan M Smith to myself, dated June 27<sup>th</sup> 1853 Together with  
all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to  
the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or apper-  
taining, To have and to hold, all and singular the said premises  
before mentioned unto the said Fannie & Harris her heirs  
and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind my heirs, executors  
and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and  
singular the said premises unto the said Fannie & Harris her  
heirs and assigns, against me and my heirs, and every other  
person lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or any part  
thereof.

granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant  
bargain sell and release unto the said Fannie & Harris "all that piece  
parcel and tract of land containing two hundred and twenty three  
acres, more or less, situated lying and being in the county of Green-  
ville, State of South Carolina, on both sides of Langston Creek waters  
of Reedy River, adjoining lands of Griffith M. DeL. Syre, Roberts, Cratie  
Sharp et al. and having the following lines, meters and bounds, viz:  
beginning at a Chestnut 8 x 0 m dead at the branch and running thence  
S 56 3/4 E 17.00 to a stone 8 x 0 m formerly Spanish oak at the near the  
road, thence S 84 3/8 E 28.10 to a Sourswood 8 x dead and down 0 m  
thence N 60 1/2 E 25.50 to a stone 8 x 0 m thence N 71 E 28.80 to a chestnut  
8 x 0 m thence S 70 1/4 W 27.30 to a Red Oak 8 x 0 m, cut down, thence  
North 12.80 to an ash 8 x 0 m thence N 66 1/2 W 8.66 to a Sassafras  
8 x 8 x 0 m thence S 43 W 6.90 to a Sweet Gum 8 x 0 m cut down, and  
Sweet Gum 8 x new, thence S 26 W 1.70 to a white oak 8 x 0 m cut  
down at a branch, thence down said branch to a white oak 8 x 8 x 0 m  
and 8 x 7, thence N 56 3/8 W 14.16 to a lightwood stake 3 x 0 m and stone W  
thence S 22 W 11.52 to a lightwood stake 3 x 0 m thence S 20 W 6.90 to a  
stone 8 x 7 m Red Oak gone, and thence S 36 W 9.42 to the beginning  
corner, all of which is more fully represented by a plat of the  
same made by James W. Dickson D. S. from a survey made Novem-  
ber 9<sup>th</sup> 1859." Together with all and singular the rights  
members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belong-  
ing, or in anywise incident or appertaining, To have and to hold all  
and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said  
Fannie & Harris her heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby  
bind my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever  
defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Fannie &  
Harris her heirs and assigns, against me and my heirs and  
every other person lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or  
any part thereof.
