Then 839 W 51.76 to a stone 3x Red oak dead and down there 822 E 7.00 to the Greenville Road thence with said Road to the beginning containing eighty one and one half acres more or less Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any
