To all to whom these presents shall come or be made known, or whom the same may in anywise concern, I, O. P. Jackson Receiver of the property of the late Batesville Manufacturing Company of the County of Greenville in the said State, send greeting; whereas the State of South Carolina, Ex. relations Savage & Touchston and Hamilton Deattie on or about the fifteenth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine did exhibit their summons and complaint in the Court of Common Pleas in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid setting forth amongst other things the Expiration of the Charter of said Batesville Manufacturing Company, and praying for the appointment of a receiver of the property of said Company, the calling in of the creditors of said Company, the sale of said property distribution and so forth.
