shall come or be made known,
or whom the same may in any wise concern, I S. J. Douthit
Master of the County of Greenville in the State aforesaid
Send greeting. Whereas a petition was filed in the Probate
Court for said State and County, on the 5th day of October
A.D. 1879 by Meijah B. Harrison and others against the
Harrison and Ainsel real estate to partition the
real estate of Nancy Harrison deceased and where
the said real estate was factually partitioned
and proceeded upon a wherein it was
determined by the probate court

Probate Court was without jurisdiction in such cases
and whereas it became necessary to institute proceedings in
the Court of Common Pleas for the State and County aforesaid
to confirm the said partition, and whereas a complaint
was filed in said Court of Common Pleas, on the 21st day
of October 1879 by Meijah B. Harrison against James H.
Harrison and others and upon the hearing of said cause, the
said Court amongst other things did order, adjudge and
decree, that the said partition be confirmed, and that
the Master should execute to the present owners of the
respective tracts of land, confirmatory titles thereto, and
whereas Wade H. Harrison sold to J. W. Sullivan, a portion
of the tract of land assigned to him in said partition in
the Probate Court, and the said J. W. Sullivan is now the pres-
ent owner thereof, now therefore know all men by these
presents, that I S. J. Douthit Master in and for the County
and State aforesaid, in consideration of the premises, and of
the sum of Three Dollars paid me by the said J. W. Sullivan
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted
bargained sold and released and by these presents do
grant bargain sell and release unto the said J. W.
Sullivan, his heirs and assigns, all that tract of
land situate lying and being in the County of Greenville
and State aforesaid, on Branch waters of Reedy River
adjoining lands of M. Campbell, W. H. Garrison
R. P. Shumate and G. H. Harrison and containing Fifty
four acres more or less, the same being more fully
described in the Deed from the said Wade H. Garrison
to the said J. W. Sullivan. Together with all and singular
the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances
whatsoever to the said tract of land belonging, or in
anywise appertaining, and the reversions and remain-
ders, rents, issues and profits thereof, and also all the
estate right title, interest, dower, possession, property,
benefit, claim and demand whatsoever both at law
and in equity of the said Nancy Harrison deceased
and of all the parties to the said suit and of all other
