Lowen, be appointed trustee, to whom William A. McDowell, Clerk of the said Court, should convey the said lands, to have and to hold the same to, for and upon the purpose, uses and trusts as set forth and declared in the deed reported by the said Referee; and whereas the said William A. McDowell, Clerk as aforesaid, did convey the lands mentioned in the pleadings to the said trustee. Now, therefore Know all men by these presents, that we, Thomas L. Lowen and Whittem Symmes, Trustees as aforesaid, by virtue of the power conferred upon us in and by the order and trust deed aforesaid, upon the written request of the cestuis que trust, and in performance of our duty as such trustees and also in consideration of a sum of one hundred and one dollars to us paid by W. H. Charles before the delivery of these presents, have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said W. H. Charles all that piece, parcel or lot of land being parcels of the lands above mentioned, situate and lying in the City of Greenville and County and State aforesaid containing at a state on West street corner of lot no thirty three running thereon from the corner and first full street a distance of

to a stake on street corner lot no thirty five, thence 84^{1/2} & one hundred and fifteen feet and six inches to stake on lot no thirty three thence N 55^{1/2} E two hundred and forty eight feet and seven inches to the beginning corner on West Street and known in Dicksons survey as lot no thirty four. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said W. H. Charles his heirs and assigns, forever freed from and discharged of all further trust whatever, and we do hereby bind ourselves, our heirs executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular the said premises unto the said W. H. Charles his heirs and assigns against us, and our heirs and every other person whosoever lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof by, through and under us, or trustees aforesaid.
