 these presents that

that we Henry T Holliday, Andy M Holliday
 and Louisa Holliday in the State of said
 and County of aforesaid, in consideration of
 the sum of Three thousand Dollars to us
 paid by James W Poore in the State of aforesaid,
 we have granted bargain sold and
 released and by these presents do grant

bargain sell and release unto the said James W Poore all
 that certain piece parcel and tract of land situated lying and
 being in the State and County first above mentioned, and
 containing one hundred and fifty eight acres more or
 less known as described as follows. Beginning at a
 Peach tree on Saluda River, at mouth of the Branch near
 the old Corley Bridge, thence up the meander-
 ings of the Branch to a stake 3x thence N 68 E 29 2/4
 to a stone 3x thence N 10 1/2 W 9.50 to a stone 3x, thence
 N 8 3/4 W 14.64 to a stone 3x, thence S 82 W 1.40 to a Red
 Oak 3x thence S 81 1/4 W 19.25 to a Black Oak 3x, thence
 S 80 3/4 W 24.45 to a stone 3x, on Bank of said
 River thence down the meanderings of the River to
 the beginning corner, said tract of land being known
 as the "Corley Mill" tract, and bounded by lands of J. L.
 Bohman, G. W. Holliday and the Saluda River,
 Together with all the shares on said tract and all water
 power rights including the brick mill and all fixtures
