Johnson corner, on the west side of the new Gap Creek road, thence with said road to J. H. Bromers Land, thence to a Stake on the west side of new Gap Creek road, a corner of McEager's, thence with said line to Donnis line, thence with said line to Mt. Johnsons corner on the mountain, thence with said Johnsons line to the beginning corner, Together with all and singular the rights, manors, tenements and Appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining, To have and to hold, all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said James A. Morgan his heirs and assigns forever, And do hereby bind myself my heirs, Executors, and Administrators, to warrant and defend all and singular the said premises unto the said James A.
