which has been duly proven, and is of record in
the Office of the Judge of Probate in and for the County
of Irenville in the State aforesaid, and also
in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand One
hundred and twenty five Dollars to me paid by
said William L. Humpfries, of Irenville County
in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained
sold and released and by these presents, do grant
bargain sell and deliver unto the said William
L. Humpfries all that piece, plot or part of
land, situated lying and being in the State and
County aforesaid on Waters of North Saluda
River and having the following boundaries and
