Dickson of Greenville County in the State of one said, in consideration of the sum of Six Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid, at and before the sealing of these presents by Manly Bright & William McMakin of Greenville County and State of one said, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Manly Bright & William McMakin a certain tract or parcel of lands situated in Greenville County and State aforesaid on the East side of Camp Creek a branch of South Tyger River, beginning in the road on the road leading from J. N. Sudduth by Camp Creek school house, at a stone near Camp Creek and runs with the road in an easterly direction ten chains to corner, thence N.  $39\frac{1}{4}$  E. twenty two (22 c) to stone, thence S.  $85$  E.  $5.85$  to a stone  $3 \times 2$ , by a Post Oak, thence N.  $5$  E.  $31.50$  to a stone  $3 \times 2$ , thence N.  $74$  N.  $9.60$  to a stone  $3 \times 2$ , thence S.  $58$  N.  $11.20$  to a stone  $3 \times 2$ , thence N.  $12$  N. about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  chs, thence in a southerly direction to a Post Oak, thence a little South of East to the beginning corner, containing One hundred and forty four acres, more or less.
