I, S. Dickson, know all men by these Presents,
John Crain, That S. C. Dickson of Greenville
County in the State aforesaid in consideration
of the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, to me in
hand paid at and before the sealing of these
presents by John Crain of Greenville County
and State aforesaid (the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged) have granted, bargained, sold
and released and by these presents do grant,
bargain, sell and release unto the said John
Crain a certain tract or parcel of land,
situated in Greenville County and State a-
foresaid on the west side of Camp Creek a
branch of South Tyger River; Beginning at a
stone on the East side of Camp Creek and running
a straight line to a post oak, thence in a north-
easterly direction to the back line of Lot No. 5,
thence N. 15° W. 12 to a ash 3 x 0, thence South 7° to a stone
3 x 11, thence S. 64° 4' W. 34.65 to a stone 3 x 11, thence S. 18°
E. to a stone, 3 x 11, S. 27° W. 45 to the road leading by
J. N. Suddeth to Camp Creek School House, thence
with said road in an easterly direction to
beginning corner, containing One Hundred and
four Acres more or less. Being part of Lot No
4 and 5 in plats made by G. H. Dickson D. S.
the 2^d day of January 1861, adjoining lands
of Samuel Crain, David Cannon and others.
Together with all and singular the Rights, Mem-
bers, Mendicaments and appurtenances to the
said Premises belonging, or in anywise
incident or appertaining. To Have and to hold,
all and singular the said premises before
mentioned unto the said John Crain his Heirs
and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind
myself and my Heirs, Executors and Adminis-
