Henson, all my interest in that tract or parcel of land situated, lying and being in Greenville County and State of aforesaid on the south side of the Tugulow road and both sides of Fortumbers Beaver dam Creek waters of Middle Tyger River; It being a tract of 86 acres as represented by plat made by A. C. Hardin, D. S., Oct. 31, 1850, adjoining lands of B. F. Henson, Est. Thomas Campbell and others. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining thereto and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said J.
