Come: I, D. P. Verner Master in and for the County  
ofonesaid, send Greeting; whereas, Mrs. Mary E.  
DeCamps on or about the 11<sup>th</sup> day of October in the  
year of our Lord eighteen hundred and eighty seven  
exhibited her complaint in the Court of Common  
Pleas for the County ofonesaid, against M. G. DeCamps  
Adolph M. DeCamps, Christie J. B. DeCamps and  
others demanding judgment in relation to the  
real estate hereinafter mentioned and described,  
and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard  
on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1887, and such pro-  
ceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree  
of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged  
and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter  
mentioned and described, be sold by D. P. Verner  
Master in and for the County ofonesaid on the  
terms and for the purposes mentioned in the said  
decree as by reference thereto on file in said  
Court, will appear; and the said Master, after  
having duly advertised the said real estate for

bargained, sold and released and by these presents,  
do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said  
William Henson all that lot or parcel of land sit-  
uate lying and being in the County and State  
ofonesaid, within the Corporate limits of the City  
of Greenville on the corner of Townes street and  
French Alley, and known as lot No. 12 in a plat  
made by J. N. Sambern D.S. and recorded in the

on the North by lot No. 11, East by the said Townes
