his Guardian, put himself apprentice unto C. W. Gray, to learn to farm or make a farmer, and after manner of an apprentice to serve the said C. W. Gray from the date hereof, and during and unto the end and term of fifteen years or until he should become twenty-one years old, from August 1888 next ensuing, during all which term the said apprentice Austin Good shall faithfully serve, render due and lawful commands every where readily obey and shall do no damage to said C. W. Gray, nor see it done by others without telling or giving notice thereof to said C. W. Gray, shall not waste any goods nor lease them unlawfully to any nor contract matrimony with the said term, at cards, dice or any unlawful game shall not play, whereby said C. W. Gray may have damage with his own goods nor the goods of others without license from the C. W. Gray, shall neither buy nor sell, he shall not absent himself from said C. W. Gray's service day or night without leave, nor haunt ale houses, taverns or play houses, but in all things behave himself as a faithful apprentice ought to do during the said term. And the said C. W. Gray shall use the utmost of his endeavors to teach or cause to be taught or instructed the said apprentice in the art or trade of a farmer and provide and provide for him sufficient meat, drink, lodging and washing fitting for an apprentice during the term of fifteen years from August next, 1888. And for the law performance of all and singular the contents and agreements aforesaid the said parties bind themselves each unto the other jointly by these presents.
