The State of South Carolina Whereas on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of December 1876 a petition was filed in the Probate Court for Greenville County State aforesaid in a proceeding entitled Milton M. Dupree against Mary Turner, for the partition or sale of the real estate hereinafter described of Amanda M. Dupree deceased the said petitioners Milton M. Dupree and the respondent Mary Turner being the only heirs of the said Amanda M. Dupree and both being over the age of twenty-one years. And whereas after due consideration it was on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1877 ordered adjudged <sup>and</sup> decreed as follows by said court to wit: "By consent of parties it is ordered that the said Real Estate be vested in Mary Turner at Four Hundred Dollars and that she receive a deed to the same from this court on by paying in to this court Three hundred dollars (that being Milton M. Dupree's share) and one-half of the cost of this proceeding" And whereas the said Mary Turner has duly paid the said sum of Three hundred dollars and one-half of the costs of said proceeding now know all men by these presents that J. W. B. Freeman Judge of Probate for the County of Greenville by virtue of said decree <sup>and</sup> for <sup>and</sup> in consideration of the above premises and also of the sum of One Dollar to me in hand paid by the said Mary Turner <sup>at</sup> <sup>and</sup> before the sealing of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, bargained <sup>and</sup> sold <sup>and</sup> by these presents do grant, bargain <sup>and</sup> sell unto the said Mary Turner all that piece parcel or tract of land situate lying <sup>and</sup> being in the County <sup>and</sup> City of Greenville State aforesaid beginning at a stake <sup>and</sup> running thence <sup>and</sup> West 139 feet to a stake thence South 16 degrees East 172 feet a stake thence South 71 East 146 feet stake thence North 60 East 72 feet a stake <sup>and</sup> that part of the same premises bounded by said stakes
