 To I Agreement,
 P. F. Parry C. G. Granger
 This Memorandum of Agreement
 made and entered into this the
 seventh day of February A.D.
 1871, between Hudson Lee, Trustee under the marriage settlement
 of H. L. P. M. & Co., wife and Eunice M. his wife, and P. F.
 Parry and Henry G. Granger witnesseth: That the said Hudson
 Lee, Trustee, as aforesaid, commands and agrees with the said
 P. F. Parry and Henry G. Granger, to convey to them, two
 thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) of the following described tract of land, which
 lying and being in the County of Greenville, and state of
 South Carolina, to wit: All that tract or parcels of land
 situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville,
 known as "Davis Mountain" and formerly the res-
 idence of General Wadell Thompson, containing about
 Thousand (1000) acres, more or less, as per Deed of Con-
 cession C. Jones, and Cecilia Thompson to Henry, S. C. M.
 Leontine, record in Office of Register of Deeds
 Greenville for Greenville County, South Carolina, in
 Book 19-29, Page 58, on Sept 9-14, A.D. 1871. Bounded by
 lands of Thomas Steane, Dawson and others, having
 such bounds and boundaries as are described in the
 Original Tract to Wadell Thompson, and in the Deed
 from Williamson Dawson, and Cecilia Thompson to Wadell
 Thompson, to which reference is hereby made, more
 fully described, Land Two Thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) thereof, hereby
 agreed to be conveyed to said P. F. Parry and Henry
 G. Granger to be ascertained and determined in the
 manner herein after set forth. In consideration
 of the sale and agreement to convey Two Thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) of said
 Land by said Hudson Lee, Trustee, the said P. F. Parry
 and Henry G. Granger to pay a sum total of

said Hudson Lee, Trustee, to pay him therefore, the sum of
 Ninety Nine Thousand, Nine Hundred, and 33/100 (\$99,888.33) Dol-
 lars, in the manner following, to wit: By their joint and several
 Note, payable in Sixty (60) Days, for Seven Thousand, Seven Hun-
 dred and Seventy Seven and 77/100 (\$7,777.77,) Dollars, dated from
 the execution of this agreement, bearing 7% interest, and the
 Balance by Bond of P. F. Parry and Henry G. Granger, bear-
 ing same date herewith, with interest at the rate of seven (7)
 per cent per annum, and payable out or before the first
 (1st) day of January A.D. 1873, secured by a mortgage of
 the Land to be so conveyed. But it is expressly agreed
 that if, said P. F. Parry and Henry G. Granger shall fail
 to pay said Note, with the interest thereon, at maturity,
 then this Agreement of sale shall terminate and have no
 force and effect whatsoever. And the said P. F. Parry and
 Henry G. Granger further command and agree with the said
 Hudson Lee, Trustee, and it is a part of the consideration
 of said sale, that they will construct and equip a Dandy
 Railroad, running through the property to be conveyed, and
 complete the same within One year from the date hereof;
 that they will survey the entire tract of Land, and have an
 accurate plan or Plat there of: laying out the Ridge and
 Level portion, into Building Lots of about One acre each, and
 such streets as may be necessary to make such lots accessible;
 And the shapes of the said Lands, into Building Lots as above
 mentioned, or into Farm Lots of about five (5) acres each;
 that these Lots and Farms shall be consecutively numbered
 on the above mentioned Plan or Plat of the Property, when
 the same is completed, by dynamite between the Tracts
 and Tracts, Each Tract ($\frac{2}{3}$) Lot or Farm, in the consecutive
 numberings thereof, except the Plan or Plat aforesaid, and
 shall remain the property of the Trust Estate of
 H. L. P. M. Leontine and wife, unaffected in any manner
 by this Agreement of sale, which is intended to secure the
 conveyance to the said P. F. Parry and Henry G. Granger
 of the remaining Lots and Farms (being with the streets
 and Roads, Two Thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) of the entire tract), to be
 ascertain'd in the manner above stated, and to be
 conveyed, when said Plat and survey shall have been
 made, by the respective grantees. And the said
 P. F. Parry and Henry G. Granger further command
 and agree with the said Hudson Lee, Trustee, as a part
 of the consideration of the sale and agreement to convey
