 and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto  
 the said James H. Green a certain tract or plantation of land  
 in the State and County aforesaid lying on both sides of Ham-  
 bone Creek and on Cone Branch waters of Enoree River being  
 a part of three tracts one granted to George Russell one to  
 Solomon Kemp the other part to Henry Benson containing  
 one hundred and sixty acres more or less Beginning at a  
 S. O. down thence due South 14 chains and some links to a  
 B. O. bush 3x thence S 36 W 8.50. chs to a white Oak 3x down thence  
 S 25 E 6.40. chs to a maple 3x thence N 50. E 3.83. to a pine 3x  
 S 40 E 10.50. chs to a B. O. 3x thence S 79 E. 8.50. chs to a stake 3x  
 Cone Branch thence with the meander of said Branch to a

 my heirs and all other persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to  
 claim the same or any part thereof Witness my hand and seal

 thousand eight hundred and ninety one and in the hundred  
 and sixteenth year of the Independence of the United States
