South Carolina Greenville County

Whereas J. H. Morgan owns a lot  
of land on the west side of and fronting on Main Street in  
the City of Greenville State and County aforesaid adjoining  
a lot on the North side owned by James T. Williams. Morgan  
said lot extending back from Main Street one hundred  
and thirty-eight feet and five inches and has thereon  
a two story brick building commencing on said Main Street  
and extending back eighty three feet and three inches  
leaving fifty-five feet and two inches of said lot unoccupied  
by any house or houses. And whereas said James T. Williams  
owns the adjoining lot aforesaid the same running through  
from Main Street to Lander Streets and has a brick building  
extending the whole length of said lot being two stories  
at each end but only one in the middle for a space of  
about fifty feet, and whereas the roof on the greater  
part of said buildings is so constructed that it bears all  
the water running falling or accumulating upon it  
in and upon the said vacant portion of Morgan's  
said lot. And whereas said James T. Williams has  
been and is enjoying said grant privilege and easement  
for several years without formal authority or paying  
valuable consideration for same and the said J. H.  
Morgan desiring to limit said grant privilege and  
easement and fix the terms thereof according to law
