Whereas under the Act of the Legislature of the State of South Carolina, approved December 24th 1890 the Trustees of the Wadsworth Poor School and their successors in office are authorized and empowered to sell and convey in fee simple to any person who shall purchase all or any portion of the lands left by the last will and testament of Thomas Wadsworth deceased, for the support of a poor school in Laurens County, if in their judgment it will be best for the interest of said school,

And whereas it has been determined by said Trustees that it will be best for the interest of said school that the lands hereinafter described be sold and the said lands being a portion of the land left by the last will and testament of Thomas Wadsworth deceased, for the support of a poor school in Laurens County

And therefore know all men by these presents that we H. G. Wallace M. D. Chris. M. M. League, C. C. Fuller and W. H. Workman Trustees of the Wadsworth Poor School of Laurens County in the state aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five Dollars to us in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, bargained and sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto Charlie Means his heirs and assigns forever all that piece parcel or lot of land situated lying and being in Greenville County, and State aforesaid on head water of Richland Creek of Rudy Run, containing two acres more or less and full legal marks, bounds and ~~and~~ follows, viz Beginning on a stone 8 x 8, Run S 73° W. 2.67.
