Gilvatt Sheriff aforesaid by virtue of said writ of *Fieri Facias* aforesaid to me directed and delivered as aforesaid, and by virtue of the Statute in such case made and provided, and for and in consideration of the said sum of Seventeen Dollars to be in hand paid, or secured to be paid, by the said Rosaline Hudson, the receipt of payment whereof I do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Rosaline Hudson her heirs and assigns forever, the said tract piece and parcel of land with its appurtenances, and all the estate, right title and interest which the said W. A. Hudson of right had of in and to the same, to have and to hold the said piece parcel and tract of land with its appurtenances unto the said Rosaline Hudson her heirs and assigns forever, as fully and absolutely as I the said Perry D.
